



# **Emergency Service Corps Monthly Activities Report: February 2024**

## **Summary**

The ESC team supported both Denver area Klondorees, providing radio comms, a Dispatcher/Medic, Hi-Vis vests/traffic wands and other staff and support. The February ESC Meeting was cancelled due to a sudden illness on my part. We believe I caught a case of COVID during or just before the Denver Klondoree 1. I am recovered now but missed all the fun at Klondoree 2.

We also had to cancel the Feb 24 1<sup>st</sup> Aid Training class due to schedule conflicts. This class has been replaced with a Wilderness 1<sup>st</sup> Aid course on April 20-21, 2024.

We have been working with ARRL to prepare introductory briefings and training on Amateur Radio. Today an introductory presentation prepared by Ray Dzek (N6DZK) a Scouter/Ham Operator from the Quicksilver District/Silicon Valley Monterey Bay California Council was sent to me. This appears to be a great starting point for introducing Amateur Radio to GCC Scouts and Scouters. It is attached for your reference.

## Medic Training & Support Program - Bryan Faulkner

We have a new Medic Training Lead, Bryan Faulkner. Bryan is taking over for Chrisian Joya who did a lot of work for us getting the program started.

- **Medic Training Program:** Bryan is in the process of reviewing and updating the Medic Training program and schedule. He has added an Adult/Pediatric Wilderness 1<sup>st</sup> Aid / CPR/AED course at GCC HQ in April and will be re-introducing other courses both in Denver and on the Western Slope.
- **Medic Call List:** We currently have 47 people on the Medic Call list with training/skills ranging from Basic 1<sup>st</sup> Aid to Doctors. With this list of volunteers, we have fulfilled every GCC event request for Medic Support we have received. **THANK YOU ALL.**
- **Medic Kits Inventory Standardization:** PENDING We are assisting to establish a set of standard Medic Kit inventories and then stock those kits appropriately.

#### Amateur Radio Program George Weber (Updates)

- Ham Radio Activities for Scouts: ARRL has provided a large set of Ham Radio related STEM games and activities for Scouts. If you would like a copy of these items, contact Brad Johnston.
- Radios in Scouting: We are putting together an introduction to radio program for Scouts and Scouters, like
  the attached Power Point presentation provided by Ray Dzek (N6DZK) a Scouter/Ham Operator from the
  Quicksilver District/Silicon Valley Monterey Bay California Council. I envision this to be a single hour to an
  hour and a half presentation used during a Wednesday ESC Meeting or on request available for Roundtables
  and Units like we do with the Winter Camping program. Your thoughts are very welcome.
- Amateur Radio Training Program: We are working with ARRL to develop a Scout/Scouter centric training program for gaining the Technician License. Your thoughts are very welcome
- McNeil Scout Ranch Radio Shack: A procedure to authorize Scouts and Scouters to operate the station is still in process. A security gate like the one used at the CAP Ham Shack to prevent unauthorized manipulation of the equipment has been delivered. We will be looking to set up an "Installation Party" sometime this spring.
- McNeil Scout Ranch Ham Radio Repeater: The KB0BSA repeater at camp (PV) is on 447.325 with a MINUS offset and a 151.4 Hz tone required. The big thing is that the repeater will not respond to a "quick klick" or "kerchunk". You must provide audio (your ID!) Then it will give a vice ID.



- GCC Amateur Radio Program Promotion: We would like to get an article on the GCC Amateur Radio Program to be submitted to various publications including Scouting for Boys, QST, Bryan on Scouting, etc.
- Radio Library: The radios available in the Radio Library have been cataloged and packaged into convenient
  carry boxes with instructions. These radios are available for all Scouting Units to check out. Most do not
  require an Amateur Radio License to operate.

### **Mobile Operations Center Trailer**

- Network & Audio/Visual Systems: Bob Fager reports that he "has a laptop computer set up to serve as a router and file/web server. The laptop has two wired network interfaces and a wireless network interface. One of the wired interfaces will always be connected to the network inside the trailer. Then, if we connect either the other wired interface or the wireless interface to the Internet, the network within the trailer will be connected to the Internet. So, connecting the trailer to the Internet is as simple as connecting a computer to a network, either wired or wireless. The laptop also serves as a Windows (SAMBA) file server and a web server, serving any files that are uploaded to it. I'll put together written instructions on how to use it. I also have a wireless access point configured for the trailer. It will give us WiFi in/around the trailer."
- Bob is also looking into replacing the Ethernet (wired network) switch. "The switch that is in the trailer now was a very nice switch when it was produced about 20 years ago. But, it's dated and slower than modern



switches. It's 100 megabits per second. For \$100 or less we can get a rack-mount switch that is 1 gigabit (1000 megabits) per second. A modern switch will also be silent while the switch we have has fans that will add to the noise in the trailer." We are also considering the addition of a Cell Signal Boster, but this would be a later addition.

- I am also looking into the installation of a camera that can be placed on the extendable mast.
- Updates to the MOC Operations Manual and supporting documentation including a supply of blank forms are in process.

**Support Operations Trailer:** We have a new enclosed 4'x8' utility trailer to use for evacuation and program support. The trailer needs to be surveyed to determine how we want to proceed with refurbishments and enhancements. We are waiting for better weather to begin refurbishment and reconfiguration.

**PV Support Operations Storage:** A 20' shipping container has been set up at McNeil Scout Ranch to store camping gear available for use in an emergency or support to those at camp in need. The container needs to be surveyed and the gear available inventoried. Additional donated camping gear is pending to be placed in the container. Just pending availability of ESC Team and Camp personnel.

## ESC Training/Information (We Need a Lead) No New Information

Training events are on the Council Calendar.

- **Training Curriculum:** We need to review the current list of training offered and the schedule. What works, what's popular, what's needed? Shall we do a survey?
- **Training Tracking:** A tracking program needs to be revived. This will lead to award of the BSA Emergency Preparedness pin.
- **FEMA Incident Command / Community Emergency Response Team (CERT):** We would like to initiate a training program to offer courses to Scouts, Scouters and the general public.
- Mock Disaster: we need to either find a set of community mock disaster trainings or develop our own.
- **ESC Website:** We need a website and **webmaster** to help coordinate information and activities. We have collected a significant amount of information available in a Dropbox file and we are in the information loop of several other ESC related organizations but have no efficient way to distribute to the general Scouting Public.
- Safety Moments: Scouting USA is again asking all Scouting to perform a Safety Moment at the beginning of each meeting, event and activity. ESC has been asked to provide reference materials and Safety Moment training availability. We have a number of Safety Moment training available, from 10minute briefs to longer training sessions.
